WHAT ARE SPIRITUAL GIFTS?

Before diving into the survey itself, it is essential to understand what spiritual gifts actually are. The Bible teaches that when a person places their faith in Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit begins to live within them.

Along with this indwelling, the Spirit distributes gifts to each believer. These are not rewards for good behavior but tools for ministry. The Apostle Paul explains in 1 Corinthians 12 that these gifts are given for the common good. Every believer receives at least one gift, and no single gift is superior to another. Each gift functions like a different part of a human body, working together to make the whole system healthy and effective.

It is common to confuse spiritual gifts with personality traits. For example, you might be naturally outgoing, but that does not automatically mean you have the gift of evangelism. Similarly, you might be a logical thinker, but

THE BIBLICAL FOUNDATION OF SPIRITUAL GIFTS

In each of these passages, Paul lists different gifts, although the lists are not identical. This variation suggests that

the biblical authors were not providing an exhaustive catalog but rather examples of how the Spirit works in diverse ways.

Romans 12 speaks of gifts such as prophecy, serving, teaching, exhortation, giving, leadership, and mercy. First Corinthians 12 includes wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, discernment, tongues, and interpretation of tongues. Ephesians 4 focuses on the gift of apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers — often referred to as the fivefold ministry gifts. The **Spiritual Gift Survey Lifeway** draws on these biblical categories to create a comprehensive assessment that covers the most widely

recognized gifts. By grounding the survey in Scripture, Lifeway ensures that the tool remains doctrinally sound and practically useful.

HOW THE SPIRITUAL GIFT SURVEY LIFEWAY WORKS

The Lifeway survey is designed for accessibility. You do not need a theology degree to complete it. The assessment typically consists of a series of statements related to various ministry activities. For each statement, you indicate how well it describes you, usually on a scale ranging from strongly agree to strongly disagree. The questions are phrased in practical, everyday language, making them easy to apply to

your own life experiences.

For instance, a question related to the gift of teaching might ask whether you enjoy explaining biblical concepts to others in a way they can easily understand. A question related to the gift of mercy might ask whether you feel drawn to comfort people who are hurting or grieving. Once you complete all the questions, you tally your scores according to a provided key. The result is a ranked list of your dominant gifts. Who Should Take the Survey?

This survey is suitable for any believer who desires to serve more effectively.

- **Exhortation:** The ability to encourage, motivate, and come alongside others to help them grow in their faith.
- **Wisdom:** The ability to apply biblical knowledge to practical life situations with insight and

discernment.

- **Knowledge:** The ability to discover, analyze, and organize biblical information for the benefit of the church.

Serving Gifts

These gifts focus on meeting practical needs and supporting the work of the ministry:

- **Serving:** The ability to identify and meet practical needs with joy and efficiency.
- **Helps:** The ability to assist others in their ministry tasks, often behind the scenes.

- **Giving:** The ability to manage finances generously and cheerfully, often with wisdom about how resources can best be used.
- **Mercy:** The ability to show compassion and care for those who are suffering or marginalized.
- **Hospitality:** The ability to welcome others warmly and create a comfortable environment for fellowship.

ministry:

- **Leadership:** The ability to set goals, organize people and resources, and cast vision for the future.
- **Administration:** The ability to organize details, manage logistics, and ensure that ministry operations run smoothly.
- **Faith:** The ability to trust God for extraordinary things and inspire others to step out in confidence.
- **Discernment:** The ability to distinguish between truth and error, and to sense when something is spiritually off.

Leadership Gifts

These gifts involve guiding and organizing the church for effective

These gifts are more supernatural in nature and are often associated with the apostolic era, though many believe they continue today:

- **Healing:** The ability to pray for the sick and see God restore health.
- **Miracles:** The ability to be an instrument through which God performs supernatural acts.
- **Tongues:** The ability to speak in a language not learned, for personal edification or public worship.
- **Interpretation of Tongues:** The ability to

interpret a message spoken in tongues so that the church can be edified.

When you use the **Spiritual Gift Survey Lifeway**, your results will highlight which of these categories you score highest in. This gives you a clear picture of where your spiritual strengths lie.

leader, or a trusted mentor. They can help you see how your gifts fit into existing ministry needs. If your top gift is teaching, look for opportunities to lead a Bible study or serve as a classroom helper. If your gift is mercy, consider joining a visitation team or a counseling ministry.

It is also wise to start small. You do not need to launch a full-scale ministry right away. Try serving in a short-term capacity to see if your gift is confirmed through experience. After you receive your results, share them with people who know you well. Ask them if
